## Admission requirements & application documents

Prior legal education You need to have completed at least an undergraduate degree, a) other than in German law b) covering at least eight semesters of standard study time (240 ECTS or equivalent). c) with an overall final grade at least at the level of 2.5 (after conversion into the German grading system) Consideration may be given to your individual situation and the respective academic context. Please enquire, if appropriate.</p>	<p>Scans of the relevant degree certificates. Enrolment will be conditional upon later provision of original documents or certified copies.</p>
<p>2. Language proficiency You need to have a) full working proficiency in your preferred language (either English or German), and b) to acquire sufficient passive knowledge of the other by the beginning of the course.</p>	<p>Test certificate, only for your preferred language, at the level of C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages or DSH-2 (German language test for university entrance). If equivalent, different test formats may be accepted. Waivers may be granted if you have obtained a university degree or entrance qualification from an institution whose teaching language is your preferred language for the LL.M. Again, scans are required for application, at least certified documents for enrolment.</p>
<p>3. Written study plan written statement of up to 500 words describing what you would like to work on in our program and how this corresponds to your previous study and future plans. Specific reference to individual curriculum offerings and faculty expertise is an asset</p>	<p>A pdf document for your application material, including word count.</p>

If any of the required documents cannot be presented on time, conditional enrolment may be granted. In appropriate cases, you may be asked to provide interim documentation.
