1. Review: Activities of our Group in March

Moreover, we are looking forward very much to the visits/arrivals of three Fellows in April:

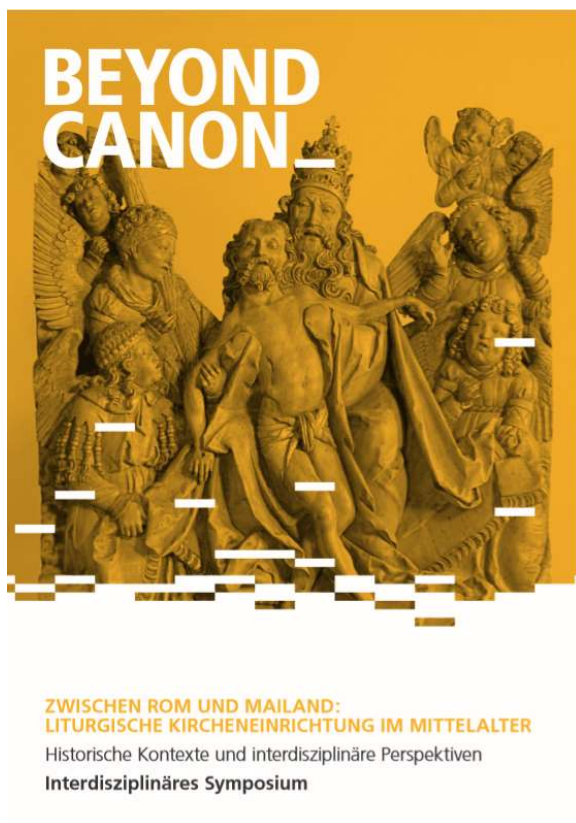
- Igor Dorfmann-Lazarev (Goethe-Universität Frankfurt a.M.) will join us on April 3 for a whole year;
