







Studienplan Bachelor of Arts (Gesamt: 180 LP)


Studienmodell mit 2 Hauptfächern

Going abroad

(Not obligatory but highly recommended!)

- **Possibilities:**
 - Study abroad ERASMUS/exchange programs/scholarships (one semester or one year; recommended after your 4th/5th semester)
 - self-organized internship abroad (funding through ERASMUS+, PROMOS)
 - Teaching Assistant (partner universities in the USA), schools in Europe (Pädagogischer Austauschdienst/International Office), e.g. St Peter's School in York)

- **Organization:**
 - start at least **one year** in advance
 - International Office & info meetings/presentations, testimonials

- **Credit Transfer possible**

Why study at the University of Regensburg?

Main research areas:
