

## Confirmation of the standard periods of study and examination deadlines to be presented to public authorities

The **standard period of study** provides information about by when a student can achieve their degree.

The **examination deadline** provides information about when the student must complete the necessary credits to obtain their degree.

If these credits cannot be shown by the examination deadline, then the assessment can be retaken up to two more times. The first retake can occur up to 6 months later. The second retake needs to occur on the examination date set for the following semester (*exception: the master's program COSOM has differing examination and retake deadlines*).

At Universität Regensburg, the **standard period of study** is,

- in accordance with the examination regulations from April 10, 2006, for the  
bachelor's program in Chemistry            6 semesters (§ 4 Para. 2 Clause 1)  
master's program in Chemistry            4 semesters (§ 4 Para. 4 Clause 1)
- in accordance with the examination regulations from April 10, 2006, for the master's program  
in Medicinal Chemistry  
4 semesters (§ 4 Para. 2 Clause 1)
- in accordance with the examination regulations from February 11, 2009, for the European  
master's program Complex Condensed Materials and Soft Matter (COSOM)  
4 semesters (§ 5 Para. 1)

The **examination deadline** for

- the bachelor's degree in Chemistry is the end of the 8th semester (§ 17 Para. 2 Clause 1)
- the master's degree in Chemistry is the end of the 6th semester (§ 28 Para. 2 Clause 1)
- the master's degree in Medicinal Chemistry is the end of the 6th semester (§ 17 Para. 2 Clause 1)

*The **examination deadline** for the master's degree COSOM is the end of the 3rd semester for examinations for the main study phase. Following this, there is a 6-month period for work on the master's thesis, which, upon application, can be extended by up to 3 months. Should a master's thesis not be passed, an application must be made within 2 months to undertake a new master's thesis. This would then also need to be completed within 6 months, with a possible 3-month extension (§ 6 Para. 2, § 7 Para. 3 and 5, and § 8 Para. 4).*

This document provides no information on whether the student has actually obtained their degree. This can only be shown via the degree certificate, or transcript of records.
