**LGBTQ+ Literary Cultures in Poland under Socialism**

With more than 20,000 students, the University of Regensburg is an innovative and interdisciplinary campus university with diverse and highly renowned research activities and a broad and attractive range of courses for young people from home and abroad. The Research Group „Light On! Queer Literatures and Cultures under Socialism,“ funded by the Volkswagen Foundation within the framework of the Freigeist Program in 2022–2027 at the University of Regensburg, invites applications for a position of doctoral researcher in LGBTQ+ literary cultures in Poland during the socialist era, to start as agreed (due to admin timeframes, the position can start in Jun 2023 or later). The position is remunerated according to TVL E-13 scale.

**Who we are:**

The goal of the Freigeist project “Light On! Queer Literatures and Cultures under Socialism” is to uncover yet unknown parts of queer literary histories and poetics in Soviet Russia, Soviet Ukraine, Soviet South Caucasus (Georgia, Armenia, and/or Azerbaijan), socialist Poland, and the GDR. This doctoral position is open to applicants with (prospective) M.A. degrees in Literary Studies, Comparative Literature, Cultural Studies, Slavic Studies, Polish Studies, History, Gender Studies, and other relevant disciplines in the Humanities. It provides an opportunity for an excellent researcher at the start of their academic career to design a doctoral project on LGBTQ+ literary cultures in socialist Poland and carry it out within an international team of outstanding researchers.

We invite proposals on a wide range of topics including, but not limited to:

- lesbian, gay, trans, bi- and queer literatures in Poland between 1945 and 1989
- LGBTQ+ literary cultures in socialist Poland (literary evenings, journals, zines, apartment theaters, etc.)
- unknown poetics and narratives of queerness in prose, drama, and/or poetry in socialist Poland
- censorship of LGBTQ+ literary subjectivities under the socialist rule, beyond the well-known cases
- transnational networks of LGBTQ+ literatures: circulations of texts, queer self-publications and publications abroad during the socialist rule

**What we offer:**

- research-focused position, remunerated according to TVL-13 scale with 65 % of work time, limited to 3 years (current salaries in this position start at 1,800 € per month after all tax deductions (netto)). Tax deductions also include contributions to social welfare systems, like pension funds and state medical insurance.
- additional research funding for conference travel and fieldwork
- shared office space, access to library collections, and other infrastructural resources
- possibility to gain teaching experience, including training in teaching in higher education
- Robust networks of doctoral and postdoctoral researchers in the Slavic Humanities and Area Studies at the U of Regensburg, connected through multiple interdisciplinary centers and graduate schools

1. Academic CV, including, among others, information about your language skills: applicants should have at least a reading knowledge of Polish and be able to communicate in one of the working languages of the research group (English or German)
2. Cover letter & research proposal (as one document, up to 3 pages altogether):

Your cover letter, expanding into a research proposal, should cover the following questions:

- 1) Where do you see an unexplored niche in studies of queer literatures in socialist Poland, and how would your doctoral project fill it? Think here that the focus of the research group is to go beyond the names and practices that have already been explored – our goal is to open up completely new, previously untouched spaces of knowledge about LGBTQ+ literary histories in socialist Poland.
  - 2) What is your previous expertise in Polish Literary/Cultural Studies and/or Gender Studies? How will it support your work on the research topic you want to pursue?
  - 3) Why would you like to carry out your doctoral research work within the Freigeist research group "Light On! Queer Literatures and Cultures under Socialism"?
3. one letter of recommendation (emailed directly by the recommending person to Tatiana Klepikova ([tatiana.klepikova@ur.de](mailto:tatiana.klepikova@ur.de)) from their institutional e-mail address by the application deadline of March 31, 2023)

### **Selection process:**

Interviews with shortlisted candidates will be held in April via Zoom. Decisions will be announced by late April.
