Responsibilities:

- Support the project scientific coordinator in the day-to-day running of the project’s activities.
- Maintain communication between the project management team and the consortium as a whole, especially with the work package and task leadership.
- Ensure the timely completion and submission of reports (technical and financial).
- Ensure the timely completion of the expected deliverables (collecting, reviewing to verify consistency and submitting reports including financial statements and related certification).
- Assist the project scientific coordinator to resolve any conflicts of whatever nature that arise within the project consortium or between the project and the European Commission.
- Organize the annual assemblies of the project in collaboration with the hosting partner.
- Arrange and attend regular management meetings between the project management team and other leaders within the project, as well as distributing the resulting protocols.
- Administering the financial contribution of the European Commission and fulfilling the financial tasks.

- Experience in the management and coordination of research projects. Prior management of projects within the context of European Commission calls would be an advantage.
