Costs:

In Bavaria, there are generally **no general tuition fees at state colleges and universities** for bachelor's and many master's programs. Instead, students pay a so-called semester fee, which typically ranges **between 100 and 200 euros per semester**, depending on the institution. This fee covers administrative costs as well as the contribution to the student services organization; a semester ticket for public transportation is not always included.

However, since the 2024/25 winter semester, some universities have begun introducing **tuition fees for international students from non-EU/EEA countries**. These include, among others, Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich and Deggendorf Institute of Technology. The fees vary depending on the program and university and currently range mostly **between 500 and 3,000 euros per semester**. It is therefore very important to check the exact regulations directly with the respective university.

In addition, all students in Germany need **health insurance**, which currently costs around **120 to 150 euros per month**.

International students coming to Germany to study on a visa (residence permit under §16b of the Residence Act) are required to provide **proof of financial means**. This is typically provided through a blocked account with a current balance of approximately **11,904 euros per year** (as of 2026; adjustments are possible). The **cost of living** has risen significantly in recent years. While older guidelines of around 600 euros per month are no longer realistic, students should currently expect the following costs: In cities like Munich, monthly expenses usually range between **1,000 and 1,400 euros**, while in smaller cities like Coburg they tend to be between **700 and 950 euros**. Other typical student cities such as Nuremberg or Regensburg range from about **800 to 1,100 euros per month**.

Housing is a major cost factor. Students can either rent their own apartment, move into a room in a shared apartment (WG), or apply for a spot in a dormitory. In Germany, dormitories are not organized by the universities themselves, but by the student services organizations, such as the Munich Student Services or the Upper Franconia Student Services. Monthly rent currently ranges from about **250 to 450 euros for a dorm room, 400 to 800 euros for a room in a shared apartment, and 700 euros or more for an apartment of one's own**, though prices vary significantly depending on the city. Finding housing is particularly difficult in large cities, which is why applying early is strongly recommended.

Requirements:

To apply to a college or university in Bavaria, you need what is known as a [Hochschulzugangsberechtigung \(HZB\)](#), i.e., a high school diploma or academic qualification that qualifies you to study in Germany. If your qualification is not directly recognized, you must first attend a Studienkolleg. A Ukrainian high school diploma obtained after 11 years of schooling is not recognized as a university entrance qualification in Germany; instead, it requires attendance at a Studienkolleg or one year of study at a Ukrainian university.

The Studienkolleg typically lasts two semesters and prepares you academically and linguistically for university studies. Admission requirements generally include German language proficiency at a minimum of **B1 to B2 level**, as well as passing an entrance exam. In Bavaria, there are the [Munich Studienkolleg](#) and the [Coburg Studienkolleg](#).

For a regular degree program, you also need sufficient **language proficiency**. For German-language degree programs, a minimum level of **B2 is generally required**, though **C1** is often required. For medical degree programs, proof of C1 proficiency is always required, as these are highly selective programs with very high admission requirements (numerus clausus). English-language degree programs also exist, but they are comparatively rare and require corresponding English proficiency certificates (e.g., IELTS or TOEFL).

To pursue a master's degree, you need a recognized bachelor's degree as well as additional documentation depending on the program, such as proof of language proficiency, a letter of motivation, or practical experience.

Application:

Applications to Bavarian universities are always submitted through a university or college. Many institutions use the services of [uni-assist](#) for this purpose, while others operate their own application portals. The exact procedures vary by institution, which is why it is important to carefully review the respective requirements.

As a general guideline, the following **application deadlines** apply: For the winter semester, the deadline is usually **July 15**; for the summer semester, **January 15**. However, exceptions are possible, particularly for programs with limited enrollment or international applications.

You will generally need the following documents for your application:

- certified copies of your high school transcripts
- a list of courses and grades
- if applicable, proof of prior studies in your home country
- language certificates
- a copy of your passport
- a resume in table format
- a passport photo

All documents must generally be submitted as **officially certified copies** and, if necessary, as **translations**. It is important to allow sufficient time for obtaining and certifying these documents. If

you have any questions or are missing documents, you should contact the International Office of the respective university well in advance.
